Know your warnings


Australian Warning System

Do not rely on an official warning to leave. Emergencies can start quickly and threaten you within minutes.

The Australian Government's Australian Warning System represents fire, flood and storm using the following symbols:

- Advice (yellow) An incident has started. There is no immediate danger. Stay up to date in case the situation changes
- Watch and Act (orange) There is a heightened level of threat. Conditions are changing and you need to act now to protect you and your family
- Emergency Warning (red) An Emergency Warning is the highest level of warning. You may be in danger and need to act immediately

National hazard icons




What to do if there is a warning?

- Stay calm. Stop what you are doing and pay attention
- If you don't understand the warning, get someone to explain by asking neighbours or friends
- Follow the advice of warnings immediately. People may die or be put in danger if they do not respond right away
- Keep in contact with family members. Make sure they know what is happening and what you plan to do
- Stay informed. Keep listening to the radio for more information in case the situation changes

Australian Fire Danger Rating System

The Australian Fire Danger Rating System describes the potential level of danger, should a bushfire start. It provides people with information so they can take action to protect themselves and others from the potentially dangerous impacts of bushfires.

Heatwave Warning Service

The Heatwave Warning service provides a nationally consistent, impact-based warning that allows the public to take steps to prepare for and mitigate the impacts of heatwaves.

The Bureau of Meteorology (BOM) issues Heatwave warnings when ten per cent or more of a weather district is in a severe or extreme heatwave. It is based on three days of unusually high maximum and minimum temperatures for that location.

They use three heatwave categories based on intensity:

LEVEL	FREQUENCY	MESSAGING	HEALTH IMPACT
LOW-INTENSITY HEATWAVE	Most common EHF >0<1	Possible heat health warning from Department of HealthMonitor local conditions	Most people can cope during these heatwaves.
SEVERE HEATWAVE	Less frequent EHF ≥1<3	 BOM Heatwave Warning issued Monitor local conditions Prepare and respond according to heatwave plans 	Can impact those most at risk such as those over the age of 65 years, particularly those with medical conditions, and the very young.
EXTREME HEATWAVE	Rarest EHF ≥3	 BOM Heatwave Warning issued Monitor local conditions Prepare and respond according to heatwave plans 	Causing widespread health issues to all population cohorts. This can impact infrastructure such as power and transport.

(EHF = Excess Heat Factor)

The warning includes a description of the expected maximum and minimum temperatures, the timing of when the heatwave will peak and/or ease and affected towns and communities within the warning area.

The Chief Health Officer may also issue a Heat Health warning when they consider forecast temperatures pose a health risk for example a single day of extremely high temperatures.

HeatWatch

The HeatWatch application allows you to calculate a personalised heat health risk. Risk is divided in six categories ranging from Minimal to Extreme.

For each risk category there is a list of evidence-based cooling strategies. Use the QR code below to access the HeatWatch application.
